Organization	Amount	Description
City of St. Francis	\$6,500.00	Main Street and Aquatic Park Landscaping. Project funds to complete the grass, shrubs, landscape rock and fertilizer for the perimeter of the pool area - which is also part of main street St Francis. Grant funds would also be used to grade and haul dirt on the east side, outside of the pool fence.
Cheyenne County Amusement Authority	\$4,780.00	Fence for Compliance. To be in compliance with the new State Laws to run the carnival at the 2018 Fair. The fence will be replaced and safety features met.
First Christian Church / Food Pantry	\$2,931.16	Increased Produce for Improved Child Health and Chronic Disease Reduction. CCFP is requesting grant funds to increase produce distribution to low income families of Cheyenne County to help improve their health equity and reduce chronic disease. Our goal is to have operational funds to allow for the increased cost of produce prior to implementing the change.
ABC Preschool	\$2,238.34	New Blinds & Blocks. ABC Preschool would like to apply for this grant so that we can obtain funds that will enable us to buy new blinds for each of the preschool rooms and additional blocks to replace and add to our worn out and deteriorating wooden blocks.
Cheyenne County Historical Society	\$2,100.00	Bringing Cheyenne County History to Life. The Cheyenne County Historical Society is requesting that the Cheyenne County New Generation Fund grant \$2100 for the purchase of paint and supplies, wallpaper, picture frames, signage, and various other materials so that volunteers can restore and enhance displays in the Museum of Cheyenne County.
Cheyenne County for Creativity	\$1,200.00	Summer Drama Camp will expose area children to a variety of creative activities including acting, staging, singing, and creating costumes and props. The camp is made possible by the cooperation of the St. Francis Recreation Commission, the help of volunteers and generosity of grant organizations.
St. Francis Public Library	\$750.00	Living Large: The continuing need for large print books. For patrons with visual challenges, this has meant providing books in multiple formats, including large print. So with this grant , the library director is to purchase approximately 28 large print books at \$27 apiece throughout the 2018 year.
St. Francis Senior Center	\$500.00	SF Senior Center Updates. Add new divided, durable commercial plates to the senior center and replace worn rubber mats in the kitchen.
